BOMBARDIER FLEXJET ANNOUNCES LAUNCH OF FLEXJET CANADA SERVICE

- *Flexjet Canada service enables Canadian-based Flexjet owners to travel point to point within Canada for the first time*
- *First fractional ownership provider to offer Canadian-based aircraft*

DALLAS, Texas, February 17, 2006 — *Bombardier Flexjet*, the fractional business jet ownership program of Bombardier Aerospace, today announced an expansion of its services in Canada, with the addition of three Canadian-registered aircraft formerly in the Bombardier corporate fleet and ten Montreal-based pilots who have joined the *Flexjet* organization.

The new *Flexjet* Canada service will enable *Flexjet* to offer an expanded Canadian travel product including, for the first time, travel between locations within Canada for owners based there. Along with providing point-to-point travel within Canada, *Flexjet* will utilize the new capacity to more efficiently service existing owners who travel between Canada and the United States.

Flexjet will initially launch the service with two *Learjet 45* aircraft and a *Challenger 604* widebody business jet, all of which will be based in Montreal.

“We now have the ability to offer *Flexjet* owners travel within Canada, which represents a tremendous opportunity to expand our services there and introduce more people to the outstanding *Flexjet* travel experience,” said Sylvain Lévesque, vice president, Bombardier *Flexjet*.

“*Flexjet* is the first fractional provider to offer Canadian-based aircraft and we take pride in being responsive to owners who have eagerly anticipated this travel option,” added Mr. Lévesque. “Our new *Flexjet* Canada service is yet another indication of our ongoing commitment to providing our owners with industry-leading service, value and choice,” he stated.

“As a *Flexjet* fractional owner based in Canada, I look forward to taking advantage of this service,” said Aldo Bensadoun, founder and chief executive officer of ALDO Group, headquartered in Montreal. “This expansion of *Flexjet* choices will enable me to travel efficiently, save time and take greater advantage of all the traditional benefits of business jet travel, including the ability to accommodate demanding itineraries and remain productive while traveling,” he added.

Established in 1995 and based in Richardson, Texas, *Bombardier Flexjet* offers a turnkey program allowing individuals or companies to purchase a share in a *Bombardier* business jet at a fraction of the full ownership cost. *Flexjet* owners select the aircraft type that best fits their needs, determine the number of hours per year they fly, and purchase shares of *Bombardier* business jets starting at a share size of 1/16th (equal to 50 hours flying). *Flexjet* guarantees access to its fleet with as little as six hours notice and can fly into many more airports than those available to commercial flights. Owners pay predictable monthly management and usage fees, while *Flexjet* manages aircraft maintenance, flight crews, hangars, fuel and insurance on their behalf. *Flexjet* is the only fractional provider that fields an exclusive family of *Bombardier* business jets, including the *Learjet 40 XR*, *Learjet 45 XR*, *Learjet 60*, *Challenger 300* and *Challenger 604*.
